



## like / would like



### What's the difference?

**like** = fancy, prefer, to be fond of

- Questions are formed using do/does:

Do you **like** apple juice?

Does she **like** pizza?

- Negations are formed by adding don't/doesn't:

I **don't like** apple juice.

She **doesn't like** pizza.

**would like** ('d like) = subjunctive

- Questions are formed by repositioning „would like“:

**Would you like** to learn English?

**Would he like** to go to cinema?

- Negations are formed by adding „n't" to end of „would“:

I **wouldn't like** to learn English.

He **wouldn't like** to go to the cinema.
